Born on August 15, 1967, in Anniston, Alabama, Darneil was the cherished son of Perry B. Jennings and Madlean Kelley Kite.

From a young age, Darneil accepted Christ and aligned himself with Miracle Revival Temple, cultivating a sense of faith and community that would guide him throughout his life. He was a proud graduate of Anniston High School Class of 1985, where he shone not only academically but also athletically, participating passionately in the school's sports programs.

Darneil's dedication to service led him to the United States Army, where he rose to the rank of Sergeant during his decade-long commitment as a Field Artillery Canon Crew Member. His service was honored with several commendations, including the Army Achievement Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Drivers Badge, Expert Qualification Badge (Rifle M16) and 1st Class (Hand Grenade).

Beyond his military service, Darneil became a beloved figure in his community, renowned for his spirit of mentorship and empowerment. As the founder and president of the South Highland Cowboys Football Team, as well as a coach and president for the East Alabama Gators, he poured his heart into inspiring young athletes. His enthusiasm for sports extended to basketball, where he also coached, instilling in many the values of teamwork and perseverance. Darneil's influence reached far and wide, impacting the

lives of young men who have gone on to compete at the Division 1 level. In quieter moments, Darneil found joy in nature, often relaxing by the riverbanks or in tranquil waters, where he would cast his line in hopes of the day's big catch, always accompanied by music and song. His love for cinematic storytelling, grilling, and caring for pets reflected the warmth and vibrancy he brought to every interaction. During football season, Darneil enjoyed watching his favorite teams, The Alabama Crimson Tide and The Dallas Cowboys. He will be missed immensely by all the hearts he has touched and lives he have encountered.

On Wednesday, July 23, 2025, Mr. Darneil Kite, affectionately known as "Koach," to family and friends transitioned from this earthly journey to his eternal resting place at the age of 57 while in the comfort of his home.
