September 27, 1944 - March 14, 2025

On September 27, 1944, in Talladega County, Alabama Iles Parker and Martha Ware Parker welcomed to their union a beautiful set of twins with one given the name Frankmon. Deacon Parker lived a remarkable 80-year life journey.

Frankmon embraced the Christian faith at an early age, uniting with the Parker Memorial Baptist Church in Eastaboga, where he cultivated a profound relationship with God. His commitment to his faith was evident through his active participation in various church organizations, including the choir, where his melodious voice brought joy to many hearts. As Chairman of the Deacon Board, a Sunday School Teacher, and Sunday School Superintendent, Frankmon was a guiding light for countless members and friends, inspiring all with his wisdom and compassion. His involvement extended beyond the church, as he proudly served as the President of the Cheerful Givers Society and played an active role in the Rushing Springs District through numerous committees.

Frankmon's formal education in the Talladega County School System culminated in his graduation from Ophelia S. Hill High School. His relentless pursuit of knowledge led him to further his education at Gadsden State Community College, where he obtained an associate degree in masonry. Throughout his career, Frankmon distinguished himself as a skilled brick

mason before dedicating many years as a supervisor at the Anniston Army Depot, where he was respected for his work ethic and leadership. After a fulfilling career, he retired to enjoy the fruits of his labor, cherishing time spent with loved ones.

On the beautiful day of June 2, 1967, Frankmon and his high school sweetheart, the former Patricia Jemison, were united in Holy Matrimony. Their blessed marriage, lasting for nearly 58 wonderful years, was a testament to their love and commitment, enriched by the joy of raising their two beloved children, Tracy and Marilyn.

Mr. Parker was a kind-hearted, soft-spoken, and beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, uncle, and friend. He possessed a sweet spirit that resonated with everyone who had the privilege of knowing him. The essence of Frankmon's character shone brightest when he was with his family, as he cherished each moment spent together. Passionate about life and adventure, traveling was one of his favorite pastimes, allowing him to create everlasting memories with his loved ones. While he held his faith and family as paramount to his existence, Frankmon also cherished his time devoted to his beloved Auburn Tiger Football Team during football, basketball, and baseball season, an experience he enjoyed sharing with family and friends alike. He was an avid outdoorsman, often seen sitting by the riverbanks with his rod and reel, patiently awaiting the catch of the day. In his younger years, he exhibited a remarkable athletic prowess, proudly playing baseball, softball, football, and NASCAR racing where his competitive spirit shone brightly.

Mr. Frankmon Parker will be profoundly missed by his family, friends, and all who have been touched by his gentle spirit throughout his earthly journey of

80 years.
