



Minister Isaac Henry Horace Bias

February 11, 1935 - February 20, 2021

Isaac Henry Horace Bias was born a twin to the union of Charles and Lylia Bowens Bias in Bremen, Georgia on February 11, 1935.

As a youth, Isaac attended Carroll County Training High School in Carrollton, Georgia. Upon his completion of high school, Isaac decided he wanted to further his education and attended Fort Valley State College in Fort Valley, Georgia (where he earned a B.S in Agriculture), Tuskegee University in Tuskegee, AL (where he earned a MS in education as well as an Ed. S) and Jacksonville State University in Jacksonville, AL (where he received a Specialty Certification in Community Resource Development). While attending these various colleges and excelling in academics, he became a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity in 1962. Isaac dedicated his service to his country by serving in the US Army, being stationed in Hamburg, Germany, before being honorably discharged and becoming a veteran. When Isaac returned home from the military, he worked as a county agent for nine years through Auburn University and was a devoted teacher in the Georgia School System for many years.

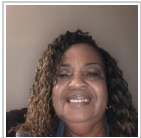
