Born on May 11, 1931, in Talladega County, Alabama, Ms. Missouri Lee Foster-Caver was the beloved daughter of the late Mr. Will and Mrs. Grace Foster and the fifth of ten cherished siblings. A vibrant spirit with an unwavering faith, Ms. Missouri accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at a young age and was baptized at Shady Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Munford, Alabama. Her commitment to her faith was evident in her decades of devoted service to her church and its community. Known affectionately as "Ms. Missouri," she held numerous vital roles, including President of the Usher Board for over 20 years, Sunday School Teacher, President of the Senior Missionary Society, Matrons, Assistant Superintendent of Sunday School, and member of both the Senior and Adult Choirs.
