Nancy Diane Dickens, a loving wife, mother and grandmother, was born on October 2, 1955, in Ashville, Alabama. She was the cherished daughter of Willie Teague and Henry Netter Teague.

At an early age, Nancy committed her life to Christ while attending Overcoming Church of Christ in Ashville, Alabama. She was very active in her church. As a youth, not only did she sing in the choir, but she also directed the choir. Her unwavering faith led her to join Mount Olive Baptist Church in 1987 where she served faithfully on the usher board.
