Mr. Robert Louis Carr, a devoted family man, started his earthly journey on December 1, 1944, in Anniston, Alabama. He was born the third of seven children to the late Joseph Carr and Mattie Mozelle Abernathy-Carr.

At an early age, Robert confessed his faith and accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior at Miracle Revival Temple Church in Anniston, Alabama under the leadership of Pastor Walter Carr. Throughout his life, he demonstrated a deep commitment to his church, by being a dedicated member, serving as a faithful Deacon and being a cheerful giver. Robert received his education in the Anniston City School System. He attended Cobb Junior High School and graduated from Anniston High School in 1965. Robert retired in 1994 as a Sergeant First Class while stationed in Fort Stewart, GA. After his military retirement he entered the civilian workforce as an employee for Primerica and the Anniston Army Depot. He continued

working at the Anniston Army Depot until his retirement in May of 2009. Robert was a Super Fan of the Anniston High School "BULLDOGS" and the Auburn University Tigers. He and his brother, Jerry, created fond memories while traveling to numerous games. He also enjoyed fishing, watching Martial Arts duels, and watching western movies. He especially loved traveling and attending family gatherings.

Along life's journey, Robert met the love of his life, Mary Helen Akles-Carr. On July 14, 1966, they were united in holy matrimony and became one. This union was blessed with three children, one son and two daughters. He was a beloved grandfather who loved ALL of his grandchildren. However, he shared a special bond with his granddaughter, Angelica Carr Brumby, who he affectionately referred to as his "Boo".

Robert fought a good fight, finished the course, and kept the faith until his departure from this life to be with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Saturday, July 6, 2024.
