“ I don't remember as much before when she moved to Riverside (I was young) but I do remember always being excited to go to Aunt Rosemary's house when my mom, Charlotte and I, would travel from Florida to see the family in Alabama. It was these earlier days that lead into the many summers I spent with her and Uncle Bob.

"Bob, don't you think this is too many people for our boat? We should have some folks go over to another boat." And we did; just in time!

I will always remember taking in the warm Alabama Summer breeze at Lake Martin, as laughter and smiles filled the awesome parties and get togethers they would regularly have. I will also value that she provided examples of the importance of setting boundaries and taking time for yourself when you need it, as well as the importance of forgiveness and moving through the challenges in life, as they come.

I recall many times helping her weed the garden, establish plants, and shift them around in the garden so they can grow brighter.

I remember her being the primary caregiver for my grandmother towards the end of her time with us, helping the family navigate a

challenging time, and allowing her true expertise to shine through by creating a calm place to come to peace with the ones we love.

Her memory will always live on.
